A chance encounter with a nesting sea turtle prompted Jean Beasley's daughter, Karen, to spearhead a project to protect the sea turtles, their nests, and the emerging hatchlings on Topsail Island. After Karen's untimely passing, Jean took up the reins of her work, and her spirit lives on through the hospital today. Although neither had envisioned a sea turtle hospital, when a seriously injured turtle washed up on Topsail Island, something had to be done! Before they knew it, a small group of volunteers united, and the Sea Turtle Hospital was born. More than 20 fully recovered sea turtles, ranging in size from 4 to 400 pounds, are released back to the ocean each year thanks to the volunteers' efforts.



The hospital's volunteers have made significant contributions to the field of sea turtle medicine, but perhaps more importantly, they have listened to the message that the sea turtles have brought them. The degradation of their habitat and the reasons behind their illnesses and injuries were hard to ignore. Jean began to speak of conservation and its importance, not only for sea turtles, but for the very survival of the planet itself. Jean's efforts at the Sea Turtle Hospital led her to become nominated and subsequently win Animal Planet's 2007 "Hero of the Year" award. Jean is recognized around the world for her conservation work, and she continues to challenge all with her message that, "Every person can make a difference, and together we can change the world!"

Jen Civelli is a mother of two, an avid lover of sea turtles, a steward for our coastal environment, and has served as a local college chemistry instructor for the past 13 years. Her passion for the ocean started while attending college at Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo and continued through her graduate school studies at San Diego State University. During her college years, through the sport of surfing, Jen began to learn and respect the ocean and all of its inhabitants. Jen felt very fortunate to have the opportunity to move to Wilmington, North Carolina in 2000 because our coastal area has so much to offer with its white sandy beaches, warm clear water, and abundant marine life.



The move to Wilmington also led Jen to discover the Karen Beasley Sea Turtle Hospital. Jen started volunteering at the hospital in 2001. To her, it felt like the sea turtles had the ability to see into her soul as she cared for them, and gave her the inspiration to fight for both their safety and for the safety of the entire coastal environment. "It was amazing to witness each turtle's own personality and see the look of thanks in their eyes!" Jen and her husband, Rick, also founded WB Surf Camp, which has supported the Sea Turtle Hospital since its inception in 2001. The Karen Beasley Sea Turtle Hospital was created to provide injured sea turtles with the love and care necessary to rehabilitate and release them back to the ocean. The hospital seeks to "provide an experiential learning site for students of biology, wildlife conservation, and/or veterinary medicine from around the world."

As sea turtle numbers keep declining and the obstacles they face continue to grow, the importance of volunteers, such as those at the hospital, becomes even more vital. By aligning with this amazing non-profit organization and igniting the wonder and amazement of the next generation, we hope to not only support the hospital's efforts physically and financially, but change the world, and change lives, one rehabilitated sea turtle at a time.



After breaking ground in May 2010, the new Sea Turtle Hospital facility in Surf City, NC opened its doors on November 7th, 2013. After years of working in a crowded, cramped 900 square-foot space, caring for up to 40 turtles, the hospital moved into its new 13,000+ square-foot building. You will be the first group of campers to work inside this amazing hospital/education center, complete with husbandry, surgical, and public education rooms.

It takes many people each day to keep the facility running smoothly. It is often difficult and hot work. However, the rewards are priceless and can be found simply by looking into a turtle's eyes just before their release back to the ocean and witnessing their pure excitement as they return home.

Campers will engage in these daily activities alongside and under the supervision of dedicated Sea Turtle Hospital volunteers and interns. Learn what it takes to care for, rehabilitate, and release one of these magnificent creatures back to the sea. Campers will also get to know the turtles by name, learn how they're named, and begin to recognize the many different personalities exhibited by each turtle.


Our mission statement of environmental conservation and philanthropy is deeply shared by our team.

Marine Biology Adventure

Ages 13-17



Sea Turtle Camp is located in the coastal town of Topsail Beach, North Carolina. During this unique program, you will work with live sea turtles while building your knowledge of marine biology fundamentals and ocean conservation.

We have five species of sea turtles that migrate in the Atlantic Ocean off the coast of North Carolina—loggerhead, green, Kemp’s ridley, leatherback, and occasionally the hawksbill.

We’ll spend two mornings working with the interns at the hospital to care for the turtles. From preparing food to cleaning tanks, you will understand the enormous amount of time, effort, and love poured into every turtle. You will get to share this newfound knowledge during a public outreach event. The goal is to one day return them to the sea after being nurtured back to health. While walking the beaches looking for nesting mothers, we’ll learn about nocturnal adaptations. We’ll also patrol in the mornings looking for fresh tracks.

Through your work at the Sea Turtle Hospital, you will earn 12 community service hours. The remaining 3 hours will be earned through beach sweeps. Trash, especially plastic, kills thousands of marine animals each year, forcing many of them towards extinction. Sea turtles are no exception and ingest or get caught in everything from fishing line to balloons. Sea turtles easily mistake plastic bags for sea jellies, their favorite food, which leads to malnutrition and potentially death.

When you’re not at the hospital you will be exploring the local beaches and salt marshes by foot, stand up paddleboard, and surfboard! You will learn about the inter-connectedness of the ocean, our coastal barrier islands, the sounds and salt marshes, and the rivers and watersheds. As marine biologists, we will sample the diversity of organisms found in southeastern North Carolina from the turbulent life in the coquina outcrop to the serene sound side communities. We’ll also see the effort that goes into replicating these habitats with a naturalist guided tour of the North Carolina Aquarium.

This amazing and intensive 11 day program dives deeper into the world of marine biology. Four half-days will be spent working at the Sea Turtle Hospital. By feeding the turtles, administering medicine, and cleaning their tanks, you will broaden your knowledge of sea turtle rehabilitation.

Through hands-on, feet-wet activities you will gain an appreciation and respect for our oceans and marine biology that will remain with you for the rest of your life.

In addition to the activities described in the Adventure, you will also have the opportunity to meet a Research Coordinator from the North Carolina Aquarium specializing in sea turtle husbandry. She will discuss and perform a sea turtle necropsy for our group. We will then climb aboard a research vessel and participate in a sample trawl with Cape Fear Community College, where we'll collect and classify a wide variety of marine life from blue crabs and shrimp to weakfish and croaker.

You will earn 25 community service hours: 20 working at the Sea Turtle Hospital and 5 performing beach sweeps and public outreach. One very special beach you will visit is Bear Island, an uninhabited barrier island that we travel to by boat. Here you will experience an environment with little to no human impact. It serves as a privately owned, publicly cared for, conservation project. In contrast, you will also visit the New Hanover County Landfill and WASTEC to fully grasp the waste of consumer-driven cultures.

By taking up residence on Topsail Island, we will be in close contact with the Topsail Island Beach Patrol, who make daily rounds looking for nesting females and fresh crawls. With first-hand knowledge of the threats facing adult sea turtles and their hatchlings, you will learn one of the most important parts of research - communication. Your group will develop an afternoon marine science presentation and use it to educate and motivate the public at the Sea Turtle Hospital.






During our final days of camp, we'll experience panoramic views of the beautiful salt marsh aboard our stand up paddle boards. We'll explore Fort Fisher, learning about sandstone ecology and enjoying the beach at the southern tip of the Cape Fear. On our trip to the North Carolina Aquarium, you will take a full tour and then go behind the scenes during the Aquarist Apprentice program. Here, you'll learn about animal husbandry and how care is provided for the different aquatic and marine species in residence.

Sea Turtle and SCUBA Camp

Open Water Course

Ages 13-17



Our Sea Turtle and SCUBA Open Water Course allows you to be immersed in the undersea world of marine biology. After spending a week rehabilitating sea turtles at the Karen Beasley Sea Turtle Hospital, you will spend the second week becoming a NAUI certified Open Water SCUBA diver.

The waters off North Carolina provide an experience like no other with what is arguably the country's finest collection of wreck diving.

SCUBA diving is not only a lifelong passion for many people, but it is a career-opening experience to the world of marine science research. It is a skill that you can take with you anywhere in the world to explore underwater ecosystems in other countries. This is a must for any teen interested in pursuing a career in marine biology.

SCUBA diving is an extremely safe sport, but one that must be taken seriously. Students begin with an online course that prepares them even before their arrival at camp. The classroom lessons with our professional instructors will cover all the skills and safety considerations, from buoyancy and breathing underwater to decompression and emergency procedures. We'll practice these crucial skills as we transition to the pool for a series of confined dives allowing us to become comfortable with our equipment and partners.

The next step is a series of open water dives, performed in the sound behind Masonboro Island. The program will be capped off with dives at the sunken *Hyde* and *Markham* ship wrecks, where you'll get a close-up look at tropical fish, small sharks, coral, algae, and maybe even a sea turtle. With 50 feet of visibility, you will see and experience amazing underwater habitats, from the smallest marine creatures to some of the largest.





SCUBA diving will give you a fish-eye view of the marine world. When not developing your skills beneath the waves, you will discover other unlikely coastal habitats of important marine life. Topsail Island exhibits vast salt marshes, towering sand dunes, and networks of maritime forests just waiting to be explored.

Camp tuition includes: lodging on both Topsail Island and in Wilmington, all meals, 24-hour same gender adult supervision, NAUI SCUBA certification, admission to all activities, all equipment, transportation including pick-up and drop-off from the Wilmington International Airport (ILM), community service certificate, Sea Turtle Camp T-shirt, and memorable group photo. Campers are responsible for round trip airfare to ILM or transportation to Topsail Island and additional money for souvenirs.

Sea Turtle and SCUBA Camp

Advanced Open Water Course

Ages 13-17



Take a deeper dive into the world of marine biology in our Sea Turtle and Advanced Open Water SCUBA Course. This program is designed for students who already have their Open Water certification and are looking for new, challenging opportunities. There are very few classroom lectures, as most of our time is spent practicing skills in the water during numerous open water dives, allowing you to gain even more confidence in your abilities.

The waters off North Carolina provide the perfect opportunity to further develop your skills, as our coast was rated one of the top diving destinations in North America. After a week of rehabilitating turtles, you'll be eager to return to the undersea environment with new skills. The Advanced Diver course is a perfect way to spend your second week at Sea Turtle Camp.

After a quick refresher session, we'll head straight to the water to develop new skills. We'll start with a trip to Masonboro Island to master underwater navigation using both natural navigation and compass navigation. These skills will help locate submerged objects, follow courses, estimate distance underwater, and plan efficient dive routes to maximize your dive experience.

Next we'll transition to the ocean for a series of dives over the course of two charter trips. While in Open Water courses you are limited to 60 feet, we'll travel below this range as part of the Deeper Diver course, opening you to more of the marine environment. We'll cap off our certification with one of the coolest experiences for marine biologists – night diving. This will allow you to see animals that were previously dormant during day time hours.

When we're not logging dives, we'll be exploring the Cape Fear region from the river's confluence in downtown Wilmington, through the rich salt marshes and estuaries, to the beach and oceanfront communities. Each dynamic habitat hosts a variety of invertebrate and vertebrate life.

Costa Rica Sea Turtle Adventure

Ages 14-17

Costa Rica is an eco-tourism treasure with over 27% of its land protected. It's very safe and has the highest standard of living in Central America. Few countries are more suitable to study sea turtles than Costa Rica; with nesting beaches on both coasts, this country is visited by 6 of the 7 species: loggerheads, greens, kemp ridleys, olive ridleys, hawksbills, and leatherbacks. And during the summer months, the Caribbean side plays host to one of the most important green sea turtle nesting events in the Western Hemisphere.

Join like minded students in a unique tropical sea turtle adventure. We'll start our adventure program in style aboard inflatable boats with a two day rafting expedition down the Pacuare River. This basin is one of the world's best rafting destinations and we'll be on the lookout for monkeys, sloths, iguanas, and tropical birds. After our first day of adrenaline rush, we'll overnight at an eco-lodge right along the river. The songs of birds and light filtering through the canopy will be our alarm clock as we wake to charge the water for another day of paddling fun.

Next we'll follow the flow of water to the Caribbean coast where numerous nights of sea turtle observation and research await us. During the summer months leatherbacks, greens, and hawksbills frequent this coastline. We will become part of a community-based, non-profit conservation organization that patrols the beaches and protects both nesting females and their eggs. We will identify turtle tracks, record tag numbers, perform egg counts, assist with nest relocations, and visit a turtle rescue center.

When not patrolling the beaches, we will immerse ourselves in the "pura vida" lifestyle. This holistic approach to living allows us to truly reflect and rejoice in our surroundings. After several Spanish language lessons, we'll be ready to communicate more with the volunteers and citizens that make this project so special. We'll even get to sample some home-cooked Caribbean fare.

Costa Rica has more to offer than just beaches. After a week at the beach we'll travel to the University of Georgia's environmental campus nestled in the mountains outside Monteverde. Due to its high elevation, Monteverde supports a lush forest community on the moisture contained in the fog and clouds enveloping the canopy. We will explore the natural and cultural beauty of this area by foot, canopy bridge, and zip line with our knowledgeable guides and even get to help some researchers out with their projects.

Camp tuition includes: lodging, all meals, 24-hour same gender adult supervision, shuttle to and from San Jose International Airport (SJO), equipment, daily transportation to and from activities, admission to all events/activities, Sea Turtle Camp t-shirt, Sea Turtle/Coastal Conservation Guide, community service certificate, and memorable group photo. Each person is responsible for: roundtrip airfare to SJO, departure tax, and personal spending money. A valid travel passport is required for travel on this adventure. Enrollment is limited to 12 students.

Hawaii Sea Turtle Adventure

Ages 13-17



On our Hawaii Sea Turtle Adventure you'll spend 14 days traversing the tropical landscapes of Oahu. Dominated on the west by an extinct shield volcano, the island's countless waterfalls, golden sand beaches, and fringing coral reefs sit on a pristine backdrop of endless blue water. Oahu is known to the locals as "the gathering place" a fitting name as this oasis of marine diversity provides our campers with an experience like no other. Students will work hands on with green sea turtles who face many obstacles in their migration to the nesting beaches along the Hawaiian coastline.

As budding marine biologists, you will be immersed in a unique array of marine and tropical habitats from the second your feet hit the white sand. We'll explore the island's unique history, geology, and ecology from mauka to makai- Polynesian for "from the mountains to the ocean." We'll stay in suites on the University of Hawaii at Manoa campus whose 320-acres university is centrally located to many of our activities and only one mile from the famous beaches at Waikiki.

The green sea turtle, known locally as honu, has called the beaches and waters of Hawaii home for thousands of years. We will have the unique opportunity to study these biologically and culturally important species both in the wild and in the lab. We'll work alongside veterinarians, aquarists, and researchers at Sea Life Park Hawaii as we perform turtle observations, prep food, provide care, meet hatchlings from the breeding program, and visit the medical care lab. We'll even participate in a long-term research study on the nutrition of the turtle's food.

With the waters of Hawaii providing habitat to many marine animals, there are opportunities to learn about the other species that call the islands home. We'll work with the water therapy team to rehabilitate sea birds. We'll step behind the scenes to learn about marine mammal training; Sea Life Park Hawaii has programs with both dolphins and sea lions. The numerous fish and invertebrates will become familiar to us during a rotation as an aquarist apprentice. There will even be the opportunity to safely snorkel with stingrays.






A trip to Hawaii wouldn't be complete without immersing ourselves in the cultural traditions Hawaii has to offer. We'll tour the Polynesian Cultural Center, snorkel the fringing and patch coral reefs, learn to surf on perfect beginner waves, stand up paddleboard along the coast, travel the Waikiki waters by outrigger canoe, and dine at an authentic Hawaiian luau. We also take interactive tours at the Waikiki Aquarium, U.S.S. Arizona Memorial at Pearl Harbor, Hanauma Bay, and Diamond Head Crater.

Camp tuition includes: lodging, all meals, 24-hour same gender adult supervision, shuttle to and from Honolulu International Airport (HNL), equipment, daily transportation to and from activities, admission to all events/activities, Sea Turtle Camp t-shirt, Sea Turtle/Coastal Conservation Guide, community service certificate, and memorable group photo. Each person is responsible for: roundtrip airfare to HNL and personal spending money. Enrollment is limited to 12 students.

Giving Back

Sea Turtle Camp is independent and privately owned, so we're funded solely by our own success. The better we perform, the more we can fulfill our mission of educating the next generation about coastal conservation and continue our support of the Sea Turtle Hospital. We know that at its core, no matter what kind of difference we want to make as a company - if our camps are not both educational and exciting, then we are not living up to our fullest potential.

Ultimately, our goal is to raise compassionate awareness and increase support for what's being done in and for our life sustaining oceans. The Sea Turtle Hospital is a place where many volunteers share their love and give their time to care for one aspect of our oceans that many people take for granted. Each person that works there does so on a purely voluntary basis and every dollar donated goes directly towards caring for the sea turtles.

To aid in the ongoing efforts to protect and rehabilitate sick and injured sea turtles a percentage of each camper's tuition is donated directly to the Karen Beasley Sea Turtle Hospital, in an amount that totals over \$52,470 to date. By aligning with this amazing non-profit organization and igniting the wonder and amazement of the next generation, we hope to not only support the efforts of the Karen Beasley Sea Turtle Hospital physically and financially, but change the world, one rehabilitated sea turtle at a time.

Last year we performed 1700 hours of community service.

We feel blessed for the work we are able to do and giving back is a critical part of our mission. When you come to Sea Turtle Camp, you support the efforts of making the world a better place.



Do I get to see real live sea turtles?

YES!!! We work very closely with the Karen Beasley Sea Turtle Hospital which has an average occupancy of 20 sea turtles with varying degrees of injury or illness. Some are even permanent residents due to the severity of their injury. If you participate in Sea Turtle and SCUBA Camp, you may even see turtles in the wild during our open water dives.

On our travel programs, we will also be working closely with real sea turtles. The Costa Rica program focuses on nesting ecology. We work with sea turtle researchers to collect nesting data. The Hawaii Sea Turtle program works alongside vets and aquarists who work with sea turtles and other marine animals.

What kind of community service will I be doing?

Community service is one of the most rewarding aspects of this camp. We like to think of it as service learning. In all of our programs we work directly with live sea turtles, which will serve as the majority of our service learning credits. We round that off with daily beach cleanups to keep our sands sparkling because we see first hand the damage that human trash cause to turtles.

What are the ages of your overnight campers? Am I too young/old to attend one of your programs?

Programs are age specific. Due to the dynamic nature of our curriculum, we group similar ages together. Programs on Topsail Island are designed for teenagers 13-17 years old. For travel programs, the age range is 13-17.

Is there as application process for Sea Turtle Camp?

Yes. Upon applying for the session of your choice, you will be sent an e-mail containing information on how to complete your application, including the submission of two academic references.

Do you offer scholarships and financial aid?

Partial scholarships may be available to limited candidates. Please e-mail or contact our office for an application. The deadline to apply is February 1.

Where do we stay during camp?

During your time at Sea Turtle Camp you will become part of the beautiful, beach front Topsail Island community. Our campers and instructors stay in air conditioned, gender specific rooms just steps from the ocean. SCUBA campers will transition to the Wilmington KOA for the second week to be closer to all of our dive sites. Each participant will have his or her own bed in gender specific a/c cabins.

Throughout our Costa Rica Camp we stay at a variety of eco-lodges who devote themselves to conservation and preserving the natural area surrounding them. Once we reach the cloud forest we will stay in the campus accommodations of the University of Georgia: Costa Rica.

In Hawaii, students will be housed in suites at the University of Hawaii Manoa. This beautiful campus is a mile from Waikiki and many of our field sites.

What kind of supervision do you provide?

We provide 24-hour, same gender adult supervision. All of our instructors live on site with our campers. All campers must follow our camp guidelines, which are explicitly gone over during orientation. If any rules are broken or any disruptive behavior takes place, the camper will be sent home at parental expense with no refund, no exceptions.

What airport is best to fly into for your program, and do you provide a shuttle service?

For our flagship marine biology programs on Topsail Island, the best airport to fly into is the Wilmington International Airport (ILM). Our educators meet all participants at baggage claim.

Costa Rica participants are required to fly into the San Jose Juan Santamaria International Airport (SJO). Our educators meet all participants once they have cleared customs, unless you opt for the Miami International Airport meet and greet option where one of our instructors will accompany you to Costa Rica.

Hawaii participants are required to fly in to the Honolulu International Airport (HNL). Our educators will meet you at baggage claim.



Do I need a passport for the travel programs?

Costa Rica participants are required to have a valid passport from the government of their country of residence in order to board a plane and enter the country. North Carolina and Hawaii only require passports for international participants.

Should I bring a friend?

More than 90% of our participants come by themselves. Participants quickly form long lasting friendships during their stay and return home with many new friends.

I am a finicky eater; can you cater to special diets?

We can accommodate many varieties of food preferences. If you require a special diet, we are happy to work with you to ensure your dietary needs are met. Many campers say we have the best “eating” out of any camp they have ever attended.

What do I need to bring?

A complete packing list will be included during your online informational process.

During the SCUBA camps, where will we be diving?

During the certification process we will perform several dives. Initial dives will take place in a lake or the ocean, depending on conditions. We will perform our final dives at the *Hyde* and *Markham*, two sunken ships located a few miles offshore from Wrightsville Beach. These shipwrecks are teeming with amazing marine life - there's no telling what you will see beneath the surface!

How long does the certification last?

Your NAUI SCUBA certification will last a lifetime, but if you do not use your skills for a long period of time it is always recommended to take a refresher course or complete a SCUBA review with a certified dive master or instructor.

Do I need any previous diving experience?

For the NAUI Open Water certification, no previous diving or snorkeling experience is needed; it is designed for beginners. Campers do need to know how to swim. For the NAUI Advanced certification, all campers must already hold an Open Water certification card. You cannot complete this course without it.

What sort of payment do you accept?

We accept VISA, MC, AMEX credit cards; checks; or money orders. All credit card payments are processed online using a secure server. There is a \$50 service charge for all returned checks.

Can I call home during camp?

We have all campers check in with their parents upon arrival but we recommend limited parental contact for the duration of the camp. Sea Turtle Camp is a growing experience, and we find that young people do best and gain confidence through independence. Campers are NOT allowed to carry cell phones at any time during camp. Any cell phones brought to camp will be collected upon arrival and returned upon departure. We will provide an after-hours number to reach the office in the event of an emergency.

Do you have insurance?

We carry a comprehensive insurance package, including general liability.

Should I purchase camp insurance?

We highly recommend that camp insurance be purchased. We are not responsible for tuition refunds or expenses incurred for trip delays, cancellation, or illness. In the event that you must cancel at the last minute due to an unforeseen event, camp insurance can help protect your investment. We make available a competitively priced program created especially for the camp/summer study industry that we believe best meets the needs of our families.


